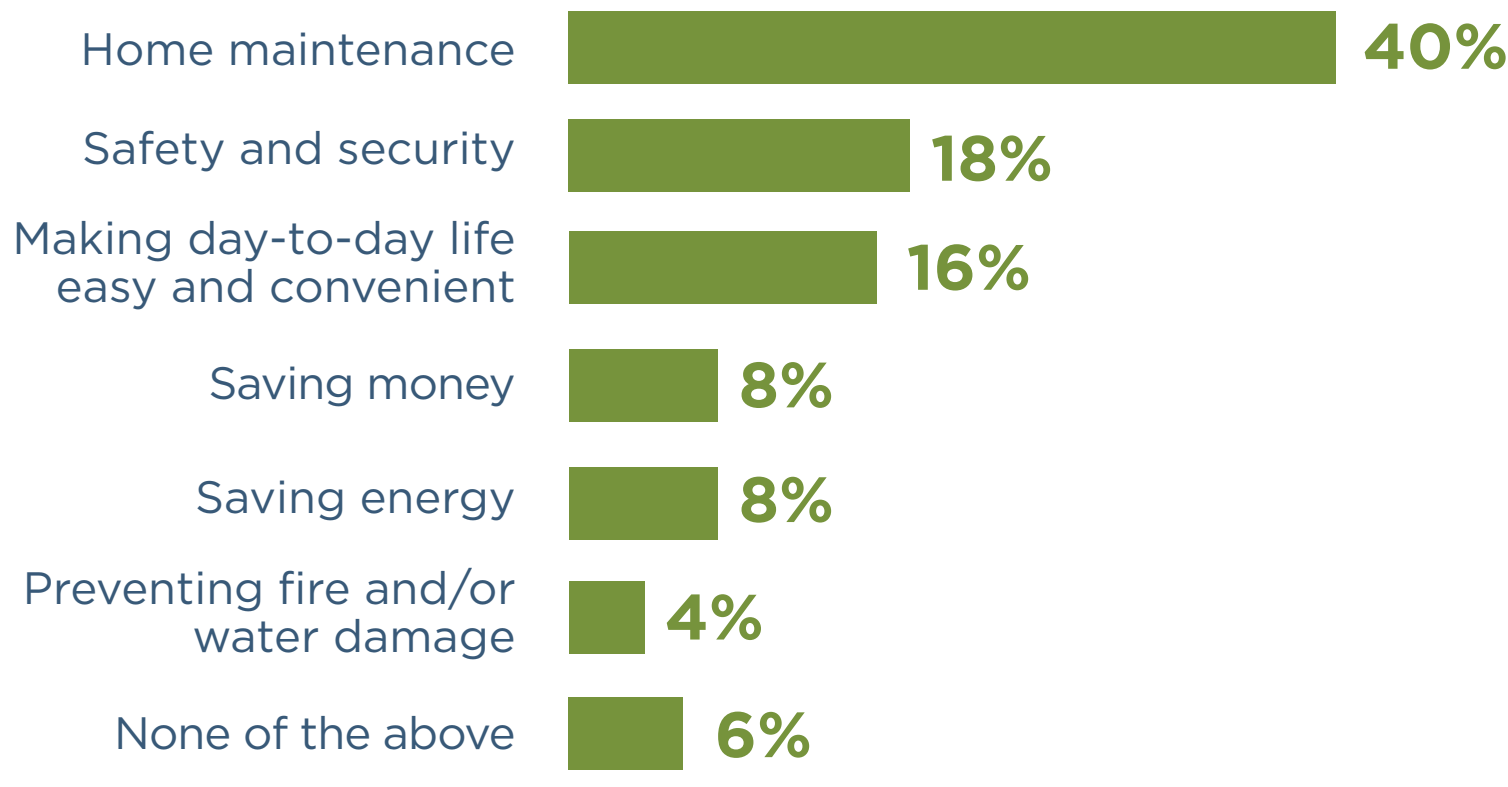

Smart home technologies that may make life easier, help with home maintenance, and enhance safety and security for homeowners 50+.

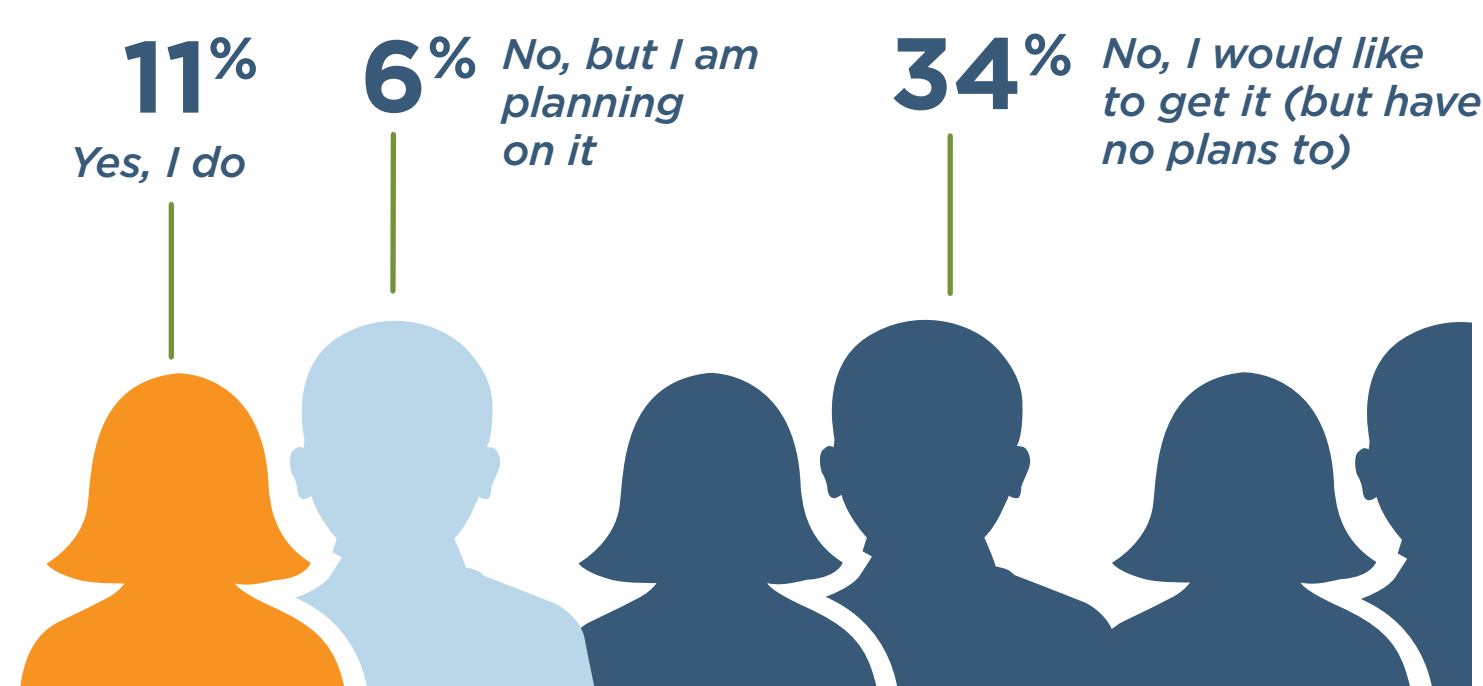


Concerns of Mature Homeowners Within Their Home



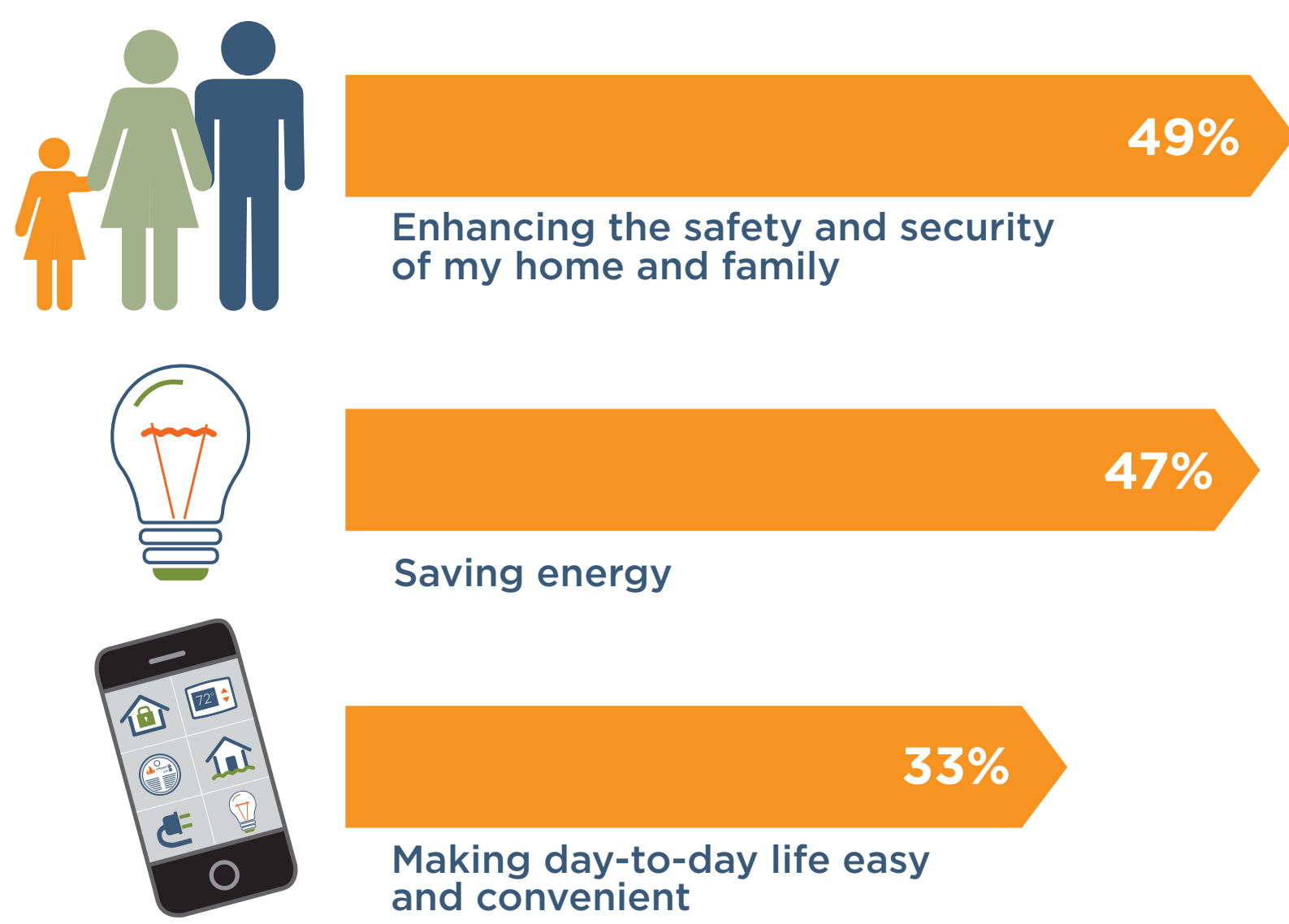
Adoption of Smart Home Technology

Top 3 Benefits of Smart Home Technology

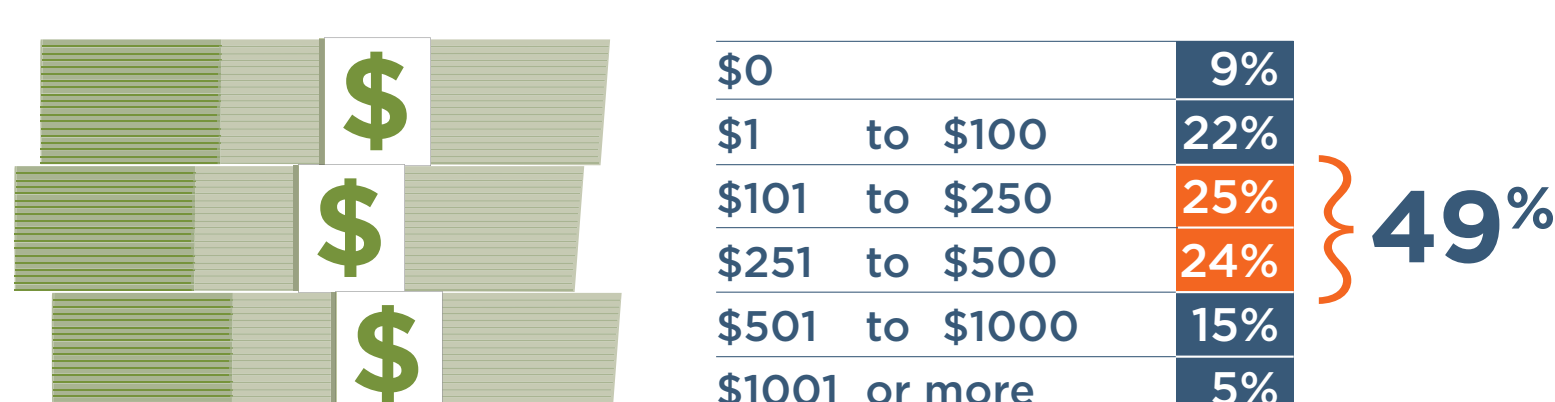


Number One Concern About Smart Home Technology

Smart home technology is defined as: Technologies, systems, and devices in the home that can be operated and/or accessed remotely by a smartphone or tablet, that may communicate with each other, and that may be able to learn patterns and adapt to the user's behaviors and preferences. Examples include smart thermostats, home security systems, automatic lighting or smart refrigerators.

The Hartford and the MIT AgeLab identified a list of experts who were professionals with expertise in the housing, technology, and aging from the fields of occupational therapy, interior design, computer science, gerontology, and engineering. The panel of nine experts completed questionnaires reviewing 25 different smart home technologies. The results of these reviews were used to identify the top 10 technologies with benefits for 50+ homeowners.

YouGov conducted an online survey among 1,092 homeowners in the U.S. between Oct. 6-10, 2016 of whom 728 were 50+. Margin of error for this study is +/- 3.6 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.
